# Welcoming Pastor Hope!

We are so pleased to welcome Pastor Hope Schwartz as our new pastor. She began April 1, and was with us for her first worship service on April 7.

The Council has contracted with Pastor Hope to be our Designated Pastor for one year, with the expectation of calling her to a permanent position at the end of that year, or possibly before.

Pastor Hope will be working half-time, 20-25 hours per week. This will be a shared ministry, with her other half-time hours being spent with Epiphany UCC in Clarence Center. A shared ministry means that we will need to be considerate of her time, as she will have obligations at both churches. The most obvious thing is that she can't be in two places at once on Sunday morning, so both churches will be changing their worship time. Our worship will be moving to 11:00 am.



So please plan to be with us to welcome Pastor Hope in the upcoming Sundays!

And Remember ... our Sunday worship service has now changed to the start time of 11:00 am.

#### My Story

On June 21, 2011, I was invited to attend a worship service at a local church. It was in this service that I had my first known encounter with God, and it changed my life forever. Although I was not sure what to expect as I walked into the church, I hoped for the possibility that my life would never be the same again. And since then, my life has never been the same! God showed up as a Way Maker, showing me that there was another way to be, another way to go, and another way to live. In that moment, God gave me a new beginning.

#### My Calling

Because God had given me a new beginning I feel called by God to make it possible for others too! I felt compelled and still do, to create opportunities for all people to experience a life-changing, life-giving, and live-saving encounter with God. I want nothing more than to share about God to others, so that all people could experience and encounter God in their own lives. In the biblical scriptures, the call from God is always a call to action. And so, I acted in faithful response to the call to ordained pastoral ministry through religious and theological education, obtaining a Bachelor of Arts in Religion from Houghton College and a Master of Divinity from Northeastern Seminary. All of this led me to the United Church of Christ.

#### My Passion

My passions within ministry were born from personal experiences in my life. It is God who had turned my pains into passions in ministry, using what I have experienced to help others in the midst of the same or similar struggles and suffering. In likeness to Jesus' own passion, God has used my pain to foster passions for ministry that are near and dear to my heart. Of greatest significance to me is making a difference in the world through actions of faith that meet the needs of the most vulnerable, oppressed, and marginalized persons in society. In the words of John Wesley, my greatest passion is to "do all the good I can, by all the means I can, in all the ways I can, in all the places I can, at all the times I can, to all the people I can, as long as I can."



### A Message from Pastor Hope

One of my favorite races to run was the Run for Rover 5k at LaSalle Park in Buffalo in 2013. Unbeknownst to me, LaSalle Park is a dog park. Because of this, there were many dogs present, as participants and recipients of the services provided by the vendors! Benefitting the Pet Emergency Fund, this 5k race was a race for all the animals in our lives.

Because I love dogs, I was excited to experience the beautiful chaos of the dog park. And what I saw in the dog park was **an image of the church**. Yeah – you read that right! Just like at the dog park, people come to church from all walks of life:



**Some of us** have grown up in the church and know everything about the way the church was and the church is and the way church could be. Just like the dogs in the dog park know where the best places to dig, the best places to play, and the best shady tree, those who've been here for a while can help those who are new find their place among us.

**Some of us** have come from other churches and bring with us some hurts. Those of us with hurts from other churches might be a bit apprehensive coming into a new church. Just like a dog who was injured in the dog park, it will take time to build trust and feel safe again.

**Some of us** have known each other for awhile. Like at the dog park, those of us who know one another are aware of the likes and dislikes, the struggles and triumphs, and the gifts and graces of members of the church. We know where they have been and where they are now and where they want to be in the future. Through our relationships with one another, we can help each other live into all that God has for us.

**Some of us** have come from other churches. Like at the dog park, the spiritual homes we've had on our journey have formed and fashioned us into who we are today. In this way, we can learn from the insights and ideas gleaned from experiences elsewhere, just like the experience gleaned from playing in different dog parks.

Y'all, the Church is like a dog park. Everyone is welcome to come! No matter where you have been, no matter what you believe, and no matter who you are! Everyone can be themselves in the church, just like in the dog park where some dogs are shy, some dogs are outgoing, and some dogs are territorial. Yet without any one of us, the church or the dog park wouldn't be the same! We need those who have been coming to the dog park for years and we need those who have just started coming to the dog park. Those who have been here for awhile know what is familiar to the congregation, yet those who have just started coming bring their own ideas and insights to help break us out of our rigidity and routines. Together, we can transform the church and the dog park into all that God has planned for us today, tomorrow, and forevermore.

Let us be like the dogs in the dog park who come just as they are, but leave each week changed by having been at the dog park.

Let us be like the dogs in the dog park who come with their favorite toys and share them with others by sharing our gifts and graces in the church.

Let us be like the dogs in the dog park who come to play together and spread the excitement and energy of fun, faith, and fellowship far and wide!
