Advent and Christmas Worship Schedule

The Season of Advent begins with our worship service on December 3. We will be sharing Holy Communion, decorating the sanctuary Christmas tree, and lighting the first candle on our advent wreath – the candle of *Hope*.

Then Advent services will continue in the weeks that follow, as we prepare for Christmas and anticipate the birth of the Christ child. Each week, we will lift up the themes of Advent. December 10, the coming of *Peace* and December 17, the *Joy* that Christ brings to the world.

This year, the fourth Sunday of Advent and Christmas Eve happen to fall on the same day. Therefore, we **WILL NOT HAVE a morning service on December 24.** We will have our candlelight Christmas Eve service that evening at **5:30 PM**.

Come and worship with us for all of these special services of the season!

In the last newsletter, we told you that Challenger's grant decision had been postponed until December, but we had reason to believe that the funds to purchase the building would still be forthcoming in December or before.

Shortly after the writing of that, we were notified that they would in fact not be receiving the grant funding. That brought an end to the sale, and we had to put the church back on the market.

Since then, we have had some possible buyers contact our realtor and tour the building. At the present time, we do not yet have any definite offers. We will keep the congregation informed of any new developments as they occur.
